Dear Friends of St. Luke Lutheran Community,

Please enjoy the year-end edition of "Good Tidings", where we recognize outstanding St. Luke accomplishments, people, and events of the past year. We also acknowledge and sincerely thank

our member Churches and donors whose contributions are central to our ministry.

After years of planning and discussion, we are extremely excited to begin the construction phase of a new campus in Minerva. The project would not have been possible without the strong support and contributions from the Minerva community. Please visit our website for construction updates and other news.

We are disappointed to report that St. Luke will not be moving forward with a community in Massillon. Many economic factors contributed to this difficult decision. In response to a changing environment, St. Luke has developed a new program called LINCS (Lutheran Interfaith Network Connection of Services), which promotes independent and healthy aging by linking seniors with available community services of which residents in Massillon and other communities can participate.

As an organization, we are heavily dependent on the State of Ohio for payment for nursing home services. Unfortunately, as part of the State budget crisis, the State continues to reduce reimbursement for programs and services to seniors. Please advocate on our behalf to our local and State officials. Also, please be our voice in your church and community in support of our benevolent care and fundraising efforts. Be assured that St. Luke will be true to our mission and continue to provide services irrespective of residents' ability to pay.

Thank you for all that you do on behalf of the St. Luke Lutheran Community. Your collective commitment to our mission and ministry truly makes St. Luke a special place. I look forward to continuing our work together to make a difference in the lives of the people we serve.

St. Luke Lutheran Community's Board of Directors is pleased to announce the start of construction for St. Luke Lutheran Community – Minerva, a 50-acre, senior living complex located on Woodale Avenue (off Route 30) in Paris Township.


A groundbreaking ceremony took place on October 14th. The initial phase of the project will be a state-of-the-art, 30-unit assisted living facility. Additional phases will include other forms of senior housing and services.



According to St. Luke Lutheran Community CEO, John L. Spieler, "We have substantial community support for this project, spearheaded by a very involved group of community leaders. These leaders were instrumental in a fundraising drive that made this project a reality." Special thanks to the St. Luke Minerva Steering Committee led by Chairperson, Martha Gartner, Pastor Joe Ertl, Karen and Al Jeske, Pat Miller, Gary Prowe, Vic Kidder, Marty Peddicord, David Porter, Vicki Ramsier, John Cox, and Dick Swallen.

The first phase of the project will cost approximately \$4.6 million. As part of the project financing, St. Luke was successful in securing a loan from the United States Department of Agriculture - Rural Development. SoL Harris/Day architects will serve as the project architect and The Knoch Corporation will be the construction manager.

St. Luke Lutheran Community to Broaden Senior Care

St. Luke Lutheran Community is reaching out to seniors beyond the walls of our campus through a program called LINCS (Lutheran Interfaith Network Connection of Services). The LINCS program will be designed to serve an age and income qualified senior population. As a nonprofit organization, we are looking for new ways to achieve excellence in aging services and enhance the quality of life both in the organization and in the community.

According to a recent report from the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, 89 percent of seniors desire to maintain an independent, home-based lifestyle, despite any functional disabilities. However, they lack knowledge about quality, costs and availability of services in their community and how to connect with these services.

The LINCS program is based on the belief that we are all entitled to remain in our familiar home setting for as long as possible and enables St. Luke to further their mission by reaching out with loving Christian care to seniors in the surrounding community.

St. Luke Lutheran Community is the recipient of a \$14,000 grant from The Aultman Foundation. The grant will enable St. Luke to develop the LINCS program to promote independent and healthy aging by linking seniors with available community services.

Survey Says: Exceptional Residential Care

St. Luke - North Canton received congratulations from the Director of the Ohio Department and Chief of the Division of Quality Assurance, State Survey Director, for a deficiency-free Residential Care survey conducted on July 23, 2009. This is the fourth consecutive year that St. Luke - North Canton has had a deficiency-free Residential Care survey.

Deficiency-free surveys indicate a significant effort on the part of the administration and staff of a residential care facility. To receive a deficiency-free survey, an assisted living facility must meet all federal and state health and safety standards. Standards encompass professional care standards, infection control, food preparation, drug administration, the environment of residents and overall quality of health care administration. The multi-day survey process involves numerous ODH employees reviewing organizational procedures while observing hands-on operations.

"We take great pride in St. Luke Lutheran Community and the quality of environment and care offered to our residents. This recognition speaks to our dedication to the St. Luke mission," said Jeannie Williams, Executive Director of St. Luke - North Canton. "It is an accomplishment for which everyone can be justifiably proud and represents the St. Luke commitment to excellence."

Prescription Donations Help Akron Residents

St. Luke Lutheran Community is assisting Summit County residents in need by providing a major, ongoing donation of medications to OPEN M. This donation, in cooperation with Omnicare Pharmacy, is made possible by an Ohio law (Ohio Prescription Drug Repository Program) also known as Karon's law, which allows medical institutions to donate unused prescription medications in sealed, single-use packaging to medical clinics so they may be redistributed to people who need them. OPEN M is a non-profit, neighborhood based, comprehensive ministry working in the community of South Akron. The OPEN M medical clinic is the only free medical clinic in the city of Akron and serves all of Summit County. In 2008, approximately 3,000 clients used the OPEN M free clinic as their primary care institution.

St. Luke Partnership Celebrates New Affordable Housing Unit

Lutheran Housing Services of Howland, a partnership with St. Luke Lutheran Community, Lutheran Social Services of Northern Ohio, and Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Retirement Services, hosted a dedication and open house for



The Manor at Howland Glen, an affordable senior housing community in Warren, on June 15. The event celebrated the success of the collaborative effort among the organizations to build income-adjusted, safe housing with a caring environment for seniors.

Howland Glen offers 49 one-bedroom apartments, a comfortably designed community room, library, arts and crafts studio, and lounges. Rent includes: utilities, refrigerator, range, carpet, and air-conditioning. Rental assistance is available through the Department of Housing and Urban Development with qualifying residents paying 30 percent of their income for rent.
